Year 2 – reading,
writing and counting
numbers to at least
100.

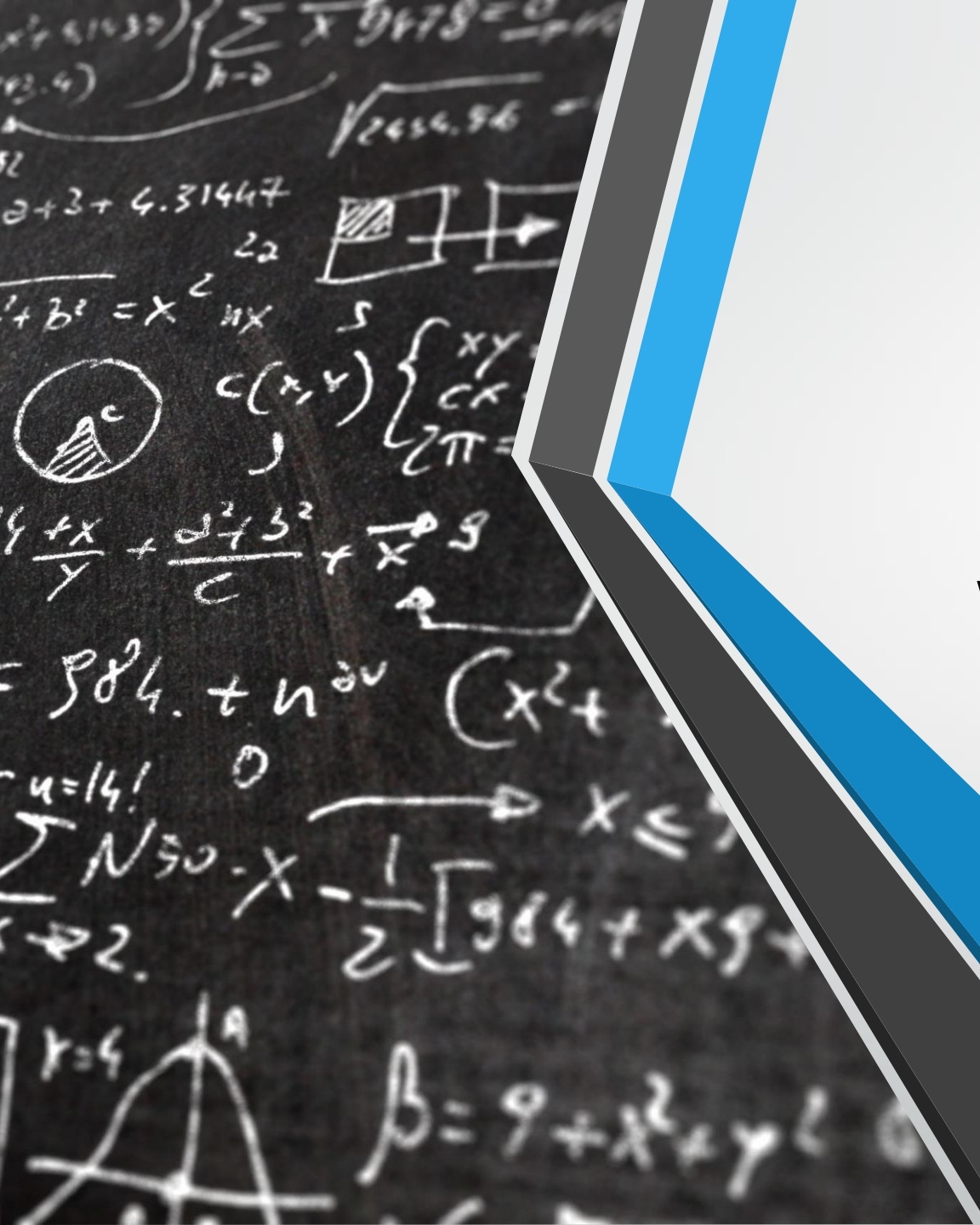
How can you help at home
